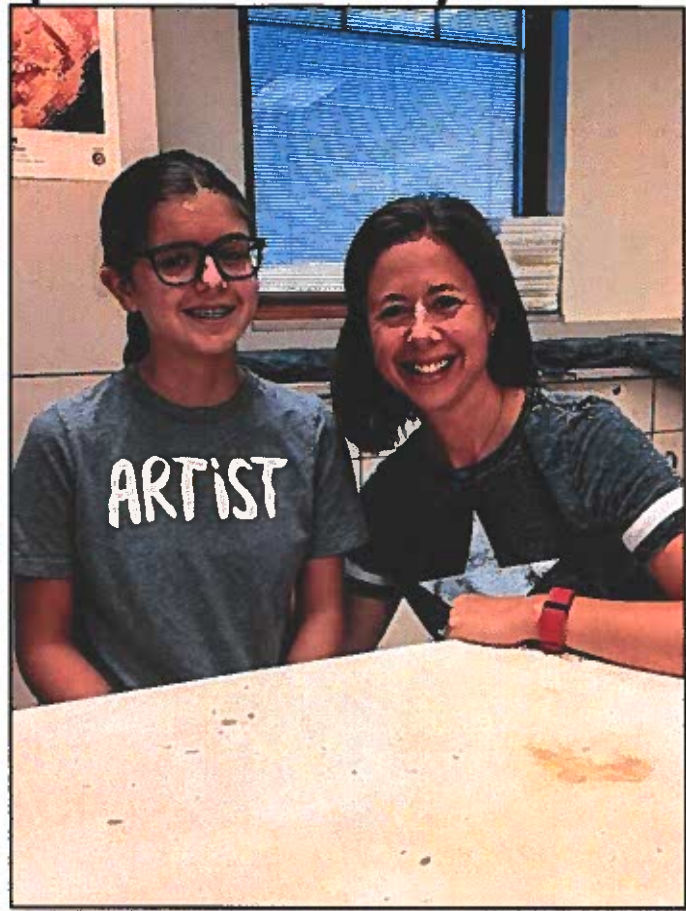


Meet Artist Hope Wheatley
